



# Public Scoping Meeting Program

DRPA/PATCO is collaborating with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to complete an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) in accordance with the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). The first step in the Glassboro-Camden Line (GCL) EIS process is to perform “scoping.”

The “scoping” process is the formal public comment phase conducted at the start of an EIS study. The primary purpose of scoping is to receive comments on the following aspects of the GCL project:

- **Purpose and Need for the project**
- **Alternatives to be analyzed**
- **Potential social, economic, and environmental impacts to be assessed**
- **Other areas of interest to you as they relate to this project**

## How to participate in this scoping meeting

### **5:30 pm Information session**

Please take the time to learn more about the project by viewing the GCL project information boards. GCL project team members are available at the boards to respond to any questions.

### **6:30 pm Formal presentation**

The GCL project team will review the GCL project background, explain the EIS process and provide insight to the project purpose and need, alternatives, and environmental/social impacts to be studied.

### **6:50 pm- Formal comment period**

**8:30 pm** Interested participants can provide verbal comments during this time. Comments will be recorded by a court reporter. Those who wish to speak should register at the start of the meeting. Each registered participant will be allotted three (3) minutes to speak.
